Skier Classification – PLEASE INITIAL ONE

Use the following definitions to help skiers properly classify themselves for skier type. Remember that skier type is not the same thing as skier ability. For example, many advanced skiers who have a smooth skiing style may be correctly classified as Type II skiers.

Type 1 Skiers

- Ski conservatively.
- Prefer slower speeds.
- Prefer easy, moderate slopes.
- Favor lower than average release/retention settings.
- Skiers who designate themselves Type I skiers accept a narrower margin of retention in order to gain a wider margin of release.
- Entry-level skiers uncertain of their classification should be classified as a Type I skier.

Type 1- Skiers

- For skiers who desire visual indicator settings lower than settings for a Type 1 skier.

Type 2 Skiers

- Ski moderately.
- Prefer a variety of speeds.
- Ski on varied terrain, including "Most Difficult" trails.
- Are skiers who do not meet all the descriptions of either Type I or Type III skiers.

Type 3 Skiers

- Ski aggressively.
- Normally ski at higher speeds.
- Prefer steeper and more challenging terrain.
- Favor higher than average release/retention settings.
- Skiers who designate themselves Type III skiers accept a narrower margin of release in order to gain a wider margin of retention.

Type 3+ Skiers

- For skiers who desire visual indicator settings higher than settings for a Type 3 skier.
